The PTV training will be held in the indoor school & all the parking is on hard standing

Entries must be received by 31st March and will be limited – please enter early!

The training will be in small groups (typically 3/4 riders) for an hour.

We will endeavour to make each group comprise riders of a similar level of experience. We will cover a selection of Trec obstacles, both ridden and led. You'll be shown how to tackle each obstacle, learn how it is judged and you'll be able to practice. All the competition obstacles will be included and ideas on how to gain most points will be available.

Training will be especially useful for people who haven't done trec before and those whose horses are not at their best indoors! The competition and training are separate and there's no need to do both

GAMES THEMED COMPETITION

Competitors will be in teams which will be allocated on the day. There will be in hand and ridden members in the teams.

Obstacles will be judged slightly differently. Style will not count in this competition - effectiveness faults and not completing an obstacle will result in penalties. You'll start with a short course of obstacles as a relay with the rest of your team, followed by Low Branches Limbo – how low can you go? We then finish with a bending race. Think of it as Trec meets Pony Club meets Strictly Come Dancing! It is guaranteed to be a fun afternoon.

RULES

Rules as per the current TREC GB Rulebook (6th edition), and general rules detailed below and elsewhere in this schedule. TREC GB Rulebook is online at <http://www.trecgb.com/Rulebook>

1. Competitions are open to all horses and ponies providing that they are a minimum of 4 years old for ridden classes and 1 year old for in hand classes.
2. Riders minimum age of 5 years old, juniors may ride horses and seniors may ride ponies.
3. No rider will be permitted to start any phase of the event unless wearing a correctly fitted hard hat with the chin strap correctly fastened meeting one or more of the current standards as listed below:
PAS 015 (2011) provided it has a BSI Kitemark OR an Inspec IC Mark
VG1 01.040 (2014-12) provided it has a BSI Kitemark OR an Inspec IC Mark
ASTM F1163 (2004a or 04a onwards), providing it has an SEI mark
SNELL E2016, providing it has a SNELL label and number
AS/NZS 3838 (2006 onwards), providing it has an SAI Global mark
4. Riders may choose to wear a body protector during any phase of the competition. If worn, Beta 3 2009 or 2018 standard is strongly recommended.
5. Tack & dress informal but safe. Riders must wear suitable riding footwear.
6. Standing Martingales and other fixed reins are forbidden. If a running martingale is used, horse must be led from headcollar and lead rope for led PTV obstacles.
7. Whips must not exceed 75cms. Spurs, if worn, must be rounded, not exceeding 3.5cms in length and must not point upwards.
8. The judges and officials decision is final and must be complied with at all times.
9. Elimination may result for any of the following reasons: excessive use of whip, abusive language, dangerous riding,

HEALTH AND SAFETY

The event manager/organiser has taken all reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present.
