GROUP TRAINING

The training will be in small groups (typically 4 or 5 riders). Ridden and In Hand groups are available. Suitable for ALL levels of rider and every kind of horse or pony. If you are new to Trec this is the one to go for. We will endeavour to make each group comprise riders of a similar level of experience.

We will cover a selection of Trec obstacles, both ridden and led:

such things as bending poles, immobility (of the horse/pony), a small jump (normally a small cross pole), mounting from a block, reining-back, riding or leading through a corridor of poles on the ground or an S-bend.

You'll be shown how to tackle each obstacle, learn how it is judged and you'll be able to practice. As with Trec obstacles in a competition, if you don't want to try an obstacle, you just need to tell us at the time (or in a competition, that obstacle's judge).

INDIVIDUAL TRAINING 30 MINUTES

A bit different this time as we won't have a normal course set up but it's the opportunity to work on anything you need help with. 30 minutes of highly focused, individual training that's most suitable for those with a bit of Trec experience but open to all, both in hand and ridden. We'll pinpoint the areas where you can make the biggest improvements, whether it's a small change or a bigger adjustment and you'll see real results. If there is anything particular you want to work on please put a note in the special request box.

GAMES THEMED COMPETITION

Competitors will be in teams which will be allocated on the day. There will be in hand and ridden members in the teams.

Obstacles will be judged slightly differently. Style will not count in this competition - effectiveness faults and not completing an obstacle will result in penalties. You'll start with a short course of obstacles as a relay with the rest of your team, followed by Low Branches Limbo – how low can you go? We then finish with a bending race. Think of it as Trec meets Pony Club meets Strictly Come Dancing! It is guaranteed to be a fun afternoon.

Refunds

Full refunds will be given for withdrawals before the closing date.

No refunds will be given for withdrawals after the closing date.

Equine Flu Requirements: In order to compete at a TREC GB event all equines must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza as follows;

The Horse must have received a primary injection (1st injection) followed by:

A second primary injection (2nd injection) not less than 21 days and not more than 92 days after the 1st injection followed by:

A first booster injection which is given not less than 150 days and not more than 215 days after the 2nd injection followed by:

Annual boosters at intervals of not more than a year apart.

(Note: vaccinations must be dated within twelve months for each year recorded on the passport, after the initial cycle of three injections were originally completed. For example, a horse vaccinated on 15th March one year needs to be vaccinated on or before 15th March the following year.)

The following conditions also apply

Horses that have received the first 2 injections are allowed to compete, provided that the 2nd injection was not given in the last 6 days before the event.

Horses that have had their first booster or annual booster within the last 6 days of an event are NOT allowed to compete.

Horses that are not vaccinated or their vaccination is out of date must commence a new programme of vaccinations. A new programme takes a minimum of 28 days before a horse can compete.

Horses with several years of annual booster vaccinations can have gaps in their record provided that;

The first two primary injections were administered correctly before 1st January 2020. (2nd injection 21-92 days after the 1st injection) and;

All annual boosters since 1st January 2020 are within time

What do we wear?

Safe and comfortable riding gear (there is no requirement for show jackets or plaiting up the horse), and your horse or pony's usual tack, will be fine, but please read the rules (below).

There will be no food or drinks for sale

RULES

RULES AS PER THE TREC GB RULEBOOK AVAILABLE TO DOWNLOAD FROM WWW.TRECGB.COM

Your attention is particularly drawn to Appendix 8 p119 2024 TREC GB Rulebook (7th edition)

1. Competitions are open to all horses and ponies providing that they are a minimum of 4 years old for ridden classes and 1 year old for in hand classes.
2. Riders, minimum age of 5 years old, juniors may ride horses and seniors may ride ponies.
3. No rider will be permitted to start any phase of the event unless wearing a correctly fitted hard hat with the chin strap correctly fastened meeting one or more of the current standards as listed below:
PAS 015 (2011) provided it has a BSI Kitemark OR an Inspec IC Mark
VG1 01.040 (2014-12) provided it has a BSI Kitemark OR an Inspec IC Mark
SEI ASTM F1163 (2015 or 2023) providing it has an SEI mark
SNELL E2016 (or later), providing it has a SNELL label and number
AS/NZS 3838 (2006 onwards), providing it has an SAI Global mark
EN 1384 : 2023 (provided it has a BSI Kitemark OR an Inspec IC mark
4. Riders may choose to wear a body protector during any phase of the competition. If worn, Beta 3 2018 standard is strongly recommended.
5. Tack & dress informal but safe. Riders must wear suitable riding footwear.
6. Standing Martingales and other fixed reins are forbidden. If a running martingale is used, horse must be led from headcollar and lead rope for led PTV obstacles.
7. Whips must not exceed 75cms. Spurs, if worn, must be rounded, not exceeding 3.5cms in length and must not point upwards.
8. The judges and officials' decision is final and must be complied with at all times. Un- corrected error on PTV course will result in a ZERO score for the PTV.

Elimination may result for any of the following reasons: excessive use of whip, abusive language, dangerous riding,

9. No horse or pony may compete more than once in any affiliated class.

10. The name and contact number of the designated event safeguarding officer (DSO) and TREC GB designated safeguarding lead (DSL), Kathy Whitehead 07926 980022 should be prominently displayed. The DSO must be present on the day of the competition

HEALTH AND SAFETY

The event manager/organiser has taken all reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the officials and stewards on the day. Trained First Aiders will be present at the event and should be summoned through an official in the event of an accident. The event manager/organiser will have contact telephone numbers for emergency veterinary service. Please take care to safeguard valuable tack and possessions. Young children must be supervised at all times. Neither the event manager/organiser nor the land/course owners can accept responsibility for loss or injury to persons or animals howsoever caused.
