FULL DAY CAMP £45

PTV training, Map room training and POR training. There will be an introduction of what to expect at a competition. You will need to bring your own pack up and corral equipment for your horse or alternatively, if you don't have corralling equipment, your horse must be happy to be on or tied to your transport for up to two hours.

PTV TRAINING

The training will be in small groups (typically 3 or 4 riders). Ridden and In Hand groups are available. Suitable for ALL levels of rider and every kind of horse or pony. We will endeavour to make each group comprise riders of a similar level of experience. We will cover a selection of Trec terrain obstacles, both ridden and led: such things as a water crossing, slopes, steps of various sizes, bank as well as a few favourites. You'll be shown how to tackle each obstacle, learn how it is judged and you'll be able to practice. As with Trec obstacles in a competition, if you don't want to try an obstacle, you just need to tell us at the time (or in a competition, that obstacle's judge). We will be using fixed obstacles so you must wear a body protector. At the end of the session everyone will go round the course and be scored.

MAP ROOM TRAINING

There will be an explanation of compass use and you will be given a route to draw on your map.

POR PRACTICE RIDE

Enter as an individual or a pair. You will be given a map either with the route marked on already – or, if you prefer, a blank one and a master map to copy. You'll be set off at your given time to follow the route at the assigned speed. There will be checkpoints along the way where you'll get a short break and a new speed. There could also be tickets out on the route. You will need to carry at least the essential items listed below on the POR. Your speeds and distances will be calculated and you will get a score.

We will finish off with announcing results and a presentation of rosettes

Essential Items

Compulsory Equipment (Penalties: see rules 3.11.7, 4.9.5 and 4.15)	Phase
Approved protective hard hat complying with current standards (listed in Appendix 2). Where rider wears a different hat for different phases, all hats must be presented for inspection at the equipment check.	All phases
Head collar, lead rope or combination bridle. Note – a headcollar and leadrope will not be required for led obstacles on the PTV unless the horse wears a running martingale which cannot be unclipped to allow the reins to be taken over the horse's head.	All Phases
Medical armband	All phases
Horse ID with rider number and emergency phone number	All phases
First aid kit for both equine and human *. The main purpose of the first aid kit is to help stop blood loss and it therefore must include: • at least 5 sterile swabs • 1 pair of round-ended scissors • 1 elastic bandage, around 10cm wide • 1 disinfectant or antiseptic solution.	POR
Torch suitable for riding after dusk	POR
Whistle *	POR
Fluorescent / reflective high-viz clothing. The minimum requirement is clearly visible fluorescent strips on the area of the rider's torso. These must be clean and not faded, when presented at the tack check.	POR
Emergency telephone numbers and grid reference of known point (supplied by the organiser)	POR
Approved body protector complying with current standard (stated in Appendix 2). See Rule 3.11.4	PTV

We will accept entry requests for the PTV Training only (£35) or POR Training only (£25) but priority will be given to those entering the full day. If you just want to enter for one element please still complete the form and your entry will be confirmed after the closing date.

This event is weather dependant and we will cancel if the ground conditions are wet enough to be hazardous – full refunds will be given if we can't go ahead

If your horse is not on the TREC GB central register, please include a copy of the complete vaccination record from the first two injections in your horses' passport and horse registration details (from the first page), alongside your entry.

What do we wear?

Safe and comfortable riding gear (there is no requirement for show jackets or plaiting up the horse), and your horse or pony's usual tack, will be fine, but please read the rules (below).

There will be no food or drinks for sale Spectators welcome

RULES

RULES AS PER THE TREC GB RULEBOOK AVAILABLE TO DOWNLOAD FROM WWW.TRECGB.COM

Your attention is particularly drawn to Appendix 8 p119 2022 TREC GB Rulebook (6th edition)

1. Competitions are open to all horses and ponies providing that they are a minimum of 4 years old for ridden classes and 1 year old for in hand classes.
2. Riders, minimum age of 5 years old, juniors may ride horses and seniors may ride ponies.
3. No rider will be permitted to start any phase of the event unless wearing a correctly fitted hard hat with the chin strap correctly fastened meeting one or more of the current standards as listed below:
PAS 015 (2011) provided it has a BSI Kitemark OR an Inspec IC Mark
VG1 01.040 (2014-12) provided it has a BSI Kitemark OR an Inspec IC Mark
ASTM F1163 (2004a or 04a onwards), providing it has a SEI mark
SNELL E2016 (or later), providing it has a SNELL label and number
AS/NZS 3838 (2006 onwards), providing it has a SAI Global mark
4. If fixed obstacles are used, a current body protector must be used and the Beta standard is changing in Jan 2024 to 2018 labels only. Riders may choose to wear a body protector during any phase of the competition.
5. Tack & dress informal but safe. Riders must wear suitable riding footwear.
6. Standing Martingales and other fixed reins are forbidden. If a running martingale is used, horse must be led from headcollar and lead rope for led PTV obstacles.
7. Whips/Spurs Competitors may carry appropriate riding whips. A whip does not have to be used in all phases. Whips must not exceed 75cm in length, except when riding side saddle when a whip of 1m is permitted. The length of a whip refers to its overall length, including any thong or tassel. **Spurs, if worn, must not exceed 3cm**, must not point upwards and must be rounded. If riders wear spurs they do not have to be worn in all phases.
8. The judges' and officials' decision is final and must be complied with at all times. Un-corrected error on PTV course will result in a ZERO score for the PTV.
Elimination may result for any of the following reasons: excessive use of whip, abusive language, dangerous riding.
9. No horse or pony may compete more than once in any affiliated class.
10. The name and contact number of the designated event safeguarding officer (DSO) and TREC GB designated safeguarding lead (DSL), **Trish Donnelly 07926 980022** should be prominently displayed. The DSO must be present on the day of the competition.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

The event manager/organiser has taken all reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the officials and stewards on the day. Trained First Aiders will be present at the event and should be summoned through an official in the event of an accident. The event manager/organiser will have contact telephone numbers for emergency veterinary service. Please take care to safeguard valuable tack and possessions. Young children must be supervised at all times. Neither the event manager/organiser nor the land/course owners can accept responsibility for loss or injury to persons or animals howsoever caused.
