





TREC GB QUALITY ROSETTES WINTER ARENA TREC SERIES 2023/2024 AFFILIATED TO TREC GB at LRAC, Kenwick Hill, Louth 2nd December 2023

All competitors (including TREC GB Blue Members) must be members of a TREC GB Affiliated club or be RED members of TREC GB itself. <u>Entries strictly limited to 20 non TREC GB Red Members</u>

All competitors must quote a TREC GB or club membership number in order to have their entry for the competition accepted. - but only fully paid up members of TREC GB will have their scores counted in the TREC GB Winter League.

Time Penalties Time Penalties of 1 penalty for every 6 seconds over the time limit will be applied

1. STARTERS (in hand and ridden) Sponsored by Doncaster Equine Salt Therapy

Suitable for anyone eligible for Newcomers and Novice horse, especially for Trec first timers. All the obstacles are on the easiest settings and it's ideal as a warm up or if you aren't sure what you are doing as outside assistance is allowed. You can be on a lead rein or with someone walking beside you and, if you forget, the judge can tell you where to go next. Riders competing at intermediate or above may not enter. No MA.

2. NEWCOMER - TREC GB league class Sponsored by Sharon Cooper BAEDT

Open to RIDERS not to have been placed 1st in two or more Winter League classes prior to 1st October 2023. PTV obstacles equivalent to Level 1

3. NOVICE HORSE - TREC GB league class Sponsored by Evolution Herbs

Open to HORSES who have not been placed 1st in two or more Winter League classes prior to 1st October 2023. PTV obstacles equivalent to Level 1

4. IN HAND Sponsored by Galloping Grooms Rug Washing and Repair

An opportunity for young or inexperienced horses to have a go at TREC by completing a course of led obstacles (with no MA); a chance too for experienced competitors to brush up their in-hand obstacle techniques. The class will be judged and scored just like a ridden class. Hats must be worn and a schooling whip is permitted. Saddles are optional, and horses can be led in either a bridle or headcollar. Open to horses and ponies that are 1 year old or older in 2023

5. PAIRS Sponsored by Nicholls Farriery Services & Sharon Cooper BAEDT

Open to any two riders, any age, on any suitable horse(s) or pony(s). The first rider to do the MA Canter and complete obstacles 1 to 5 and the second rider to complete obstacles 6 to 10 and the MA Walk. PTV obstacles equivalent to Level 1/2.

6. TOP SCORE (in hand and ridden) Sponsored by CCW Paddock Care

Complete obstacles in any order to gain as many points as possible within the time limit. Each obstacle may be attempted twice. Full rules available on the day. Open and intermediate riders obstacles equivalent to Level 2/3, Novice riders obstacles equivalent to Level 1. This class can be done entirely in hand

7. INTERMEDIATE - TREC GB league class Sponsored by H & M Haylage

Horse and rider combination not to have been placed 1st in three or more Intermediate classes, or to have won twice in the Open class at Winter TREC competitions prior to 1st October 2023. PTV obstacles equivalent to Level 2

8. OPEN INTERMEDIATE - TREC GB league class Sponsored by Floral Cupcake Bouquets

Open to all horse and rider combinations. PTV obstacles equivalent to Level 2/3.

9. OPEN - TREC GB league class Sponsored by Nicholls Farriery Services

Open to all horse and rider combinations. PTV obstacles equivalent to L3/4.

Classes may be split or amalgamated according to entries

Trec Lincolnshire Members Winter League

Open to all Trec Lincolnshire members (with current Riding membership) at no extra cost. The league will run over all the Trec Lincolnshire Winter Series 2020/21 competitions. Your top 8 scores (excluding Top Score & Pairs) over the series will be counted for the league. There is also the Frank Memorial Trophy kindly donated by Bella Craven for the best PTV Score.

Competitors who are over qualified for league classes may not enter them HC as a warm up, prior to the classes for which they are eligible.

What is Arena TREC?

Arena TREC focuses on the MA (Control of Paces) and PTV (Obstacle course) phases of TREC and events are usually run in an indoor or outdoor school.

The PTV is a course of 10 optional obstacles, each with a maximum score of 10 points. To find out more, please look at the *TREC GB Rulebook*

The MA phase consists of a 2m wide corridor 50m long, along which the rider canters as slowly as possible before returning by walking as fast as possible without breaking pace.

The Winter League will include results from all TREC GB Arena TREC competitions held from 1st October 2023 to 28th April 2024 from Affiliated classes. The best 4 placings for each horse and rider combination will be used to calculate the League standings. If a competitor is eliminated in the PTV phase, there will be no league points awarded for that round, even if they are placed in the class.

The highest four scores will be counted for the league. In the event of equal positions the TOTAL actual PTV scores (from 4 events) will be taken into account.

Riders who are not members of TREC GB can join within 48 hours of the competition for their performance at that event to count towards the TREC GB League

If your horse is not on the TREC GB central register, please include a copy of the complete vaccination record from the first two injections in your horses' passport and horse registration details (from the first page), alongside your entry.





GENERAL RULES & CONDITIONS

Placing will be decided with the rider gaining the highest combined score from the PTV and MA phases taking the first prize. In the event of equality the highest score from PTV will take precedence.

RULES AS PER THE TREC GB RULEBOOK AVAILABLE TO DOWNLOAD FROM WWW.TRECGB.COM

Your attention is particularly drawn to Appendix 8 p119 2022 TREC GB Rulebook (6th edition)

1. Competitions are open to all horses and ponies providing that they are a minimum of 4 years old for ridden classes and 1 year old for in hand classes.

2. Riders, minimum age of 5 years old, juniors may ride horses and seniors may ride ponies.

3. No rider will be permitted to start any phase of the event unless wearing a correctly fitted hard hat with the chin strap correctly fastened meeting one or more of the current standards as listed below:

PAS 015 (2011) provided it has a BSI Kitemark OR an Inspec IC Mark

VG1 01.040 (2014-12) provided it has a BSI Kitemark OR an Inspec IC Mark

ASTM F1163 (2004a or 04a onwards), providing it has a SEI mark

SNELL E2016 (or later), providing it has a SNELL label and number

AS/NZS 3838 (2006 onwards), providing it has a SAI Global mark

4. If fixed obstacles are used, a current body protector <u>must</u> be used and the Beta standard is changing in Jan 2024 to 2018 labels only. Riders may choose to wear a body protector during any phase of the competition.

5. Tack & dress informal but safe. Riders must wear suitable riding footwear.

6. Standing Martingales and other fixed reins are forbidden. If a running martingale is used, horse must be led from headcollar and lead rope for led PTV obstacles.

7. Whips/Spurs Competitors may carry appropriate riding whips. A whip does not have to be used in all phases. Whips must not exceed 75cm in length, except when riding side saddle when a whip of 1m is permitted. The length of a whip refers to its overall length, including any thong or tassel. Spurs, if worn, must not exceed 3cm, must not point upwards and must be rounded. If riders wear spurs they do not have to be worn in all phases.

8. The judges' and officials' decision is final and must be complied with at all times. Un-corrected error on PTV course will result in a ZERO score for the PTV.

Elimination may result for any of the following reasons: excessive use of whip, abusive language, dangerous riding.

9. No horse or pony may compete more than once in any affiliated class.

10. The name and contact number of the designated event safeguarding officer (DSO) and TREC GB designated safeguarding lead (DSL), **Trish Donnelly 07926 980022** should be prominently displayed. The DSO must be present on the day of the competition.
